Cristina Tzintzún Ramirez

Civil Rights Leader and Author

Cristina Tzintzún Ramirez has spent the last twenty years taking on some of the most powerful special interests in her home state of Texas. Cristina is a civil rights leader and former 2020 U.S. Senate candidate. She has organized construction workers, immigrant mothers, and young voters to build a government and economy that works for all.

Cristina championed some of the most important issues of our time, including climate change, student debt, runaway inequality, immigration and voting rights. Her work on student debt and workers' rights has led to the passage of legislation at the state and local levels.

Today, Cristina is the Executive Director of NextGen America, the nation's largest youth voting rights organization. NextGen has mobilized millions of young people to the polls, with the goal of harnessing the power of young people to reshape our country's political outcome.

Previously, Cristina founded two of Texas's largest voting and civil rights organizations: Jolt and Workers Defense Project. Jolt is a statewide organization focused on mobilizing the Latino vote. Under Cristina's leadership, Jolt mobilized tens of thousands of young Latinos. While an undergraduate student at UT Austin, she launched Workers Defense Project as a small volunteer project that evolved into a statewide organization named by The New York Times as "one of the most creative organizations for immigrant workers in the country."
